Anita Walz from Virginia Tech gave a presentation on the Open Education Library. Textbooks in many disciplines are available online at no cost and are legally sharable, editable, and can be printed at low cost. Robin Benke shared a handout from Ms. Walz with several resources.

Narda Porter discussed changes to three policies.

- Revisions to Earning a Second Degree has been approved by the Academic Program Committee and will be reviewed by the Faculty Senate at their March 7 meeting.
- The policy on withdrawals has been amended to limit students to six withdrawals in their academic career. This does not apply to withdrawing from the College, but withdrawal from a course. A later deadline for dropping a classes was discussed, and will be discussed by the faculty.
- Students may repeat a course two times, regardless of the grade earned. The most recent grade earned will be the permanent grade on the student's record.

Ms. Porter asked each department to appoint a contact person within the department to provide input on major changes to Jenzabar. An upgrade will take place in the fall of 2019 and again in the fall of 2020. These upgrades mainly involve changes in academic planning and data collection, and will result in more user-friendly reporting capabilities.
